Welcome, Pastor Simon

We will welcome our new pastor in July. His first Sunday with us will be July 7th. Please plan to be here to support him as he embarks on

this new venture with us. He is new to the Global Methodist Church as is our church.

Elder Simon Chigumira is originally from Zimbabwe where he earned a Bachelor and Master of Education and taught school for awhile. In the United States he attended Emory University and Asbury Theological Seminary where he is currently working on his Dissertation. He is now a U. S. citizen.

Simon is married to Eunice, who is also an ordained minister, with one child, 37 years old, living at home. He served in his most recent appointment for six years, and has served in various churches in Louisiana for 20 years total.

In the Narrative questionnaire provided by him he says that his leadership style is collaborative, and he believes in dealing with conflict and disagreement as soon as it occurs to resolve the situation quickly. He is comfortable with both traditional and contemporary worship styles. He says, "My partnership with the laity is central and germane to vital ministry. I am persuaded that it takes a united congregation to work cooperatively to accomplish its vision and mission. Equipping of lay leadership becomes an integral part of a successful organization." In line with this attitude, Simon says, "I believe in organizing laity around Wesleyan Class Meetings. Such class meetings enable discipleship to happen in small groups." He wants the church to be an active part of its community, and to be willing to take an active part in matters in the public square.

Now to address the elephant in the room. Yes, Simon is a black man, and this is a mostly white community. This should make no difference because we are reading and he is preaching from the same Word of God. Simon has served both mostly white and mostly black congregations. In Christ Jesus "There is neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." Here is our chance to live out this verse. Pray for Simon and his family and our church family as we journey together in Christ and in service to his kingdom.

And saying, "It is true! The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon.". --Luke 24:34 NIV

"They have taken my Lord away," she said, "and I don't know where they have put him." At this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not realize that it was Jesus. —John 20:13b-14 NIV

Mary is looking for a dead Jesus, which is why she cannot find him. Are you looking for a dead Jesus? Do you see him as that person who lived awhile in Israel a long time ago? Do you think of him as in heaven looking down at you now and then? Or do you see him as he who lives within you now as the presence of the Holy Spirit?

"the coming of the Spirit is dependent on the departure of Jesus; in some fashion, when Jesus dies, when he begins his departure to the Father, the arrival of the Spirit will be a feature of his gift. In fact...the identities of Jesus and the Spirit—Paraclete are so closely aligned that they are almost indistinguishable. The promised Spirit will be Jesus' alter-ego, resuming the role of Jesus after his departure." (see John 16:17); Burger, p. 545.

Mary did not find Jesus. Jesus found her. Jesus looks for us every day. He calls for us by name, asking us to hear him, recognize him, to know he is alive! And dwells with us who believe. He is alive! Discover the truth of that statement with R. W. Dale of Birmingham as he did one day when preparing his Easter sermon:

"the thought of the risen Lord broke in upon him as it had never done before. 'Christ is alive," I said to myself; "alive!" and then I paused; -- "alive!" And then I paused again; "alive!" Can that really be true? Living as really as I myself am? I got up and walked about repeating "Christ is living! "Christ is living!" ...It was to me a new discovery. I thought that all along I had believed it; but not until that moment did I feel sure about it." (I.B. p. 792)

Mary did not recognize Jesus when he appeared to her at the tomb—because she was looking for a dead Jesus, a different Jesus. But he was alive! Do we miss Jesus when he comes to us now because we are looking for a different Jesus? A dead Jesus? Or a different kind of Jesus? One that we want to see, who will tell us everything we want to hear, and give us permission to do

what we want to do? He is alive! He chooses what to say to us, and what he wants us to do for him. We do not do the deciding. He is alive! Listen for him and to him!

"The empty tomb is now history, it is a cave to be disregarded (as it was among the earliest Christians), and only the living Jesus matters." (Burge, p. 555)

In verse 20:17, Jesus tells Mary not to hang onto him. He wants her to know that his resurrection does not mean a return to the way things were with his disciples on earth. No. Things are different now. His presence will soon be manifested in a broader, wider, more lasting way than could ever be when he lived with them as a man. He will soon send His Spirit to be "with [them] always, even to the end of the age."

He lives! He is alive! He is with us! "the gift of Christ is not merely a gift of salvation, if by salvation we mean freedom from condemnation and the promise of eternal life. Jesus offers us life, not mere freedom from judgment." (Burge, p. 546) Jesus is alive! Be alive in him! Feel him and live in the power of the abundant life he imparts to you as he lives in and through you. For Jesus is alive, here and now and forever.

Hurt by "Christians"

As a volunteer youth minister, I would often encounter young people who had been "injured" by "the church" or by "Christians" or a "Christian."

I would tell them about my dog. I would tell them I had to finally had to get rid of my dog because of all the things he did that drove me crazy. He would scratch all my furniture legs trying to sharpen his claws. He would rub against my legs with arched back but not let me pet him. He would not use the litter box and mess up my apartment. He would scratch me and anyone who visited me with his sharp claws. After several of these descriptions of my dog's behavior, one student would finally stop me and say "Mr. Dale, you are not describing a dog. That's a cat you are talking about." "No!" I would insist. "It was a dog." My student would argue and insist that I was absolutely NOT describing dog behavior, but CAT behavior. I would tell them I KNOW it was a dog because my veterinarian TOLD me it was a dog. The student would say that my veterinarian was wrong! I would finally say "Yes. He was wrong."

I would tell the group that some of them had shared with me how "Christians" had hurt them or lied to them or betrayed them. I would say "But the people you described to me don't sound like Christians at all. In fact, they sound like the opposite." I would then share with them the fruits of the spirit, and Bible verses which deal with behavior and outer signs in a person's life which indicate that they are indeed a "real" Christian. I would encourage them to always judge truth by what the Bible says, not what people say.
