Pastor's Pen

I continue to be aware of a need for God's revival among His people. Revival is the restoration of God's presence among His people. I am reminded of Moses in Exodus 33, when God threatens to remove His presence from His people. Moses realizes that there is no life apart from the presence of God. Moses therefore pleads for God to return to His people saying, "If Your Presence does not go with us, do not bring us up from here." Yes, God's presence is essential for a church to be the Church. We can hardly do life or church without His presence.

Many people would like to ask a question. Why do we need God's presence? Jesus was aware of the need of the disciples to receive the Gift of the Holy Spirit before they started doing God's work. They were instructed to remain in Jerusalem until they were fully revived and anointed by the Holy Spirit. When God is present, life is different. Apostle Peter in Acts 3:19 says, "Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord." Peter understood that the mighty presence of God alone could refresh and renew the hearts of His people.

I am persuaded that if we are ever going to recover a biblical sense of fear and awe towards our God, we need His manifest presence in our midst. When God is present, our lives are reoriented around Him and not ourselves. God is therefore the front and center of our lives, and we cease to lean not on our own understanding. The need to successfully wage war and do real battle with sin in our lives can never be underestimated. We become intensely aware of our own sinfulness in the presence of God. God's holiness does highlight all the impurities in our lives. Isaiah became aware of his unclean lips when he encountered the glory of God in the temple.

If ever we expect the shackles of division, poverty, racism or prejudice to be broken, we need a revival. If we need our land to be healed, we learn from 2 Chronicles 7:14 that God says that if His people are repentant, then He will "heal their land." We struggle with earthquakes, hurricanes, tornadoes, fire, drugs, droughts, floods... from natural disasters to national debt. You may be asking this question, "Is God getting our attention"? I am reminded of the cry for revival in Psalm 85:6 when the Psalmist declares, "Will you not revive us again, that

Something to Pray About

When they heard about the resurrection of the dead, some of them sneered, but others said, "We want to hear you again on this subject." Acts 17:32 NIV

After his suffering, [Jesus] showed himself to these men and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. (Acts 1:3 NIV)

In our post-modern era, people don't mind speaking about religion. They do object to any one religion claiming absolute truth and authority of their faith. This is the main conflict between post-modernism and Christianity. Christians claim that we know the ultimate truth that applies to everyone. How dare we be so intolerant and arrogant!

"[N]o group should attempt to convert others to their side out of a belief that they possess absolute truth." But this is precisely what Christians do. We also did it during the New Testament times, and that led to Christians being mocked and persecuted and murdered, because they lived in a pluralistic religious era, too. People were allowed to follow their on philosophical and religious beliefs, as long as, they were willing to "bow down to Caesar" and refer to him as a god.

Because of the resurrection of our Lord, Jesus, we can boldly claim the truth of the Gospel. The resurrection of Jesus is "the ultimate proof of [the gospel's] uniqueness" (Fernando, p. 59). (see also Acts 17:31)

Our era has lost trust in objective truth and lives by the dictum that there are no absolutes (which is expanded from Albert Einstein's scientific theory of relativity). People today even deny objective reality. They are more focused on feelings, personal experiences, and perceptions than rationalism, cause and effect, or facts—so no truth can be universally applied (Fernando, p. 60).

Even in the church today, instead of focusing on what the Bible says, we tend to focus on subjective and comforting feelings and our own experiences. So, whatever makes me feel good about God and myself is what I concentrate on—not on God's law and absolute truth and power claims. For instance, sexual behavior among Christians is nearly the same as among non-Christians. "...the Bible is no longer the primary factor in determining Christian behavior" (Fernando, p. 61). This type of "faith" cannot sustain us in the 'dark night of the soul'—something we all experience at one point or another.

People, even in the Church, are refusing to submit to the rule of a transcendent God, instead they indulge in a pantheistic religiosity or spirituality and look to themselves and in themselves for their own personal version of godhood.

"In summary, the gospel clashes with the pluralism, the subjectivism, and the pantheism of our day." [So] we have the pastoral responsibility of helping develop Christians who know how to study and apply the Scriptures to their daily lives—that is, people who practice their belief in the supreme authority of Scripture in a postmodern world" (Fernando, p. 63). Once we have accomplished that, a spiritual awakening can happen in the church and in the world's modern culture, too.
